The Primary Care Nurse will be an integrated team member working to their full scope of practice, including performing restricted activities as outlined in the Health Professional Act within the primary care setting.

The Primary Care Nurse will work with the family physicians in the community, other health professionals and local and regional programming in a multidisciplinary environment to ensure a high quality of evidence-based health care to the practice population. The Primary Care Nurse will report to a Primary Care Manager.

Key Roles & Responsibilities:

- To work collaboratively in a patient centred, integrated team-based practice within a primary care setting.
- To participate in culturally appropriate care of individual patients, practice populations and associated communities.
- To provide comprehensive nursing services and care to patients in the family practice setting.
- The nurse will assess, plan, implement and evaluate care to patients of all ages and work with patients with complex health care needs.
- To make professional, competent and autonomous decisions with patients as a member of the multidisciplinary team.
- To act as a nursing resource to other multidisciplinary team members, healthcare institutions and community agencies or programs.
- To ensure accurate, objective and timely clinical documentation in the appropriate medical record.
